IMAGINING OUR FUTURE – PURSUING OUR FUTURE

THANK YOU to all those who submitted comments, questions and suggestions following the November Parish House Renovation presentation. As you heard in the presentation, it has been sixty years since a major renovation was done for the upgrade of the Parish House facility. While we have a great asset in this facility, after consultation with the diocese, we were encouraged to look into upgrading the premises in order to make it more appealing and serviceable for today's needs. Your feedback has been shared among the initial renovation team (Karen Givnish, Dave Prezuhy, Jean London, Marv Walters and the Rector) and your Vestry.

The following questions are a sample of the questions and comments received. It is our intention to keep you informed by providing answers to more questions over the next several months as the project and its details continue to evolve. Meanwhile, we hope all of you will continue the conversation and become involved in whatever capacity you feel called to participate. Also, a great big THANK YOU to those of you who have stepped forward and offered your time and talent to ensure our success. Please stay tuned for more details to be announced and more invitations to meet and take action.

Several questions were received asking about phasing of the project and what work will be done in each phase. For instance:

• What would be done first?

The renovation of the Guild Room will be the first phase scheduled. This will include air conditioning, paint and window treatments, carpeting, and the purchase of new chairs. This first phase can be accomplished relatively quickly and without major or prolonged interruption. Once this is accomplished, the room will present an updated and more attractive venue for small gatherings of parishioners and outside interests: funeral receptions, bridal and baby showers, family dinners, etc. The rental revenue from these occasions could then begin to provide seed money for the follow-on phases.

Earth Cares:

Please consider reducing your carbon footprint somehow this new year. Barbara Harvey shared this amazing site with me. I was unaware that the plastic film on cases of food, etc. can be recycled. Go to www.plasticfilmrecycling.org to find out more. Another site that is very helpful is how2recycle.info. Milk cartons have a logo that shows this site. This site tells where these objects can be dropped off instead of being put in the waste stream. I recall one place that takes these objects is the Target store. Remember that I will redirect used markers of any brand. Crayons will pay the postage to mail a box fill of used markers to them. 8.1 pounds of markers is converted into 1 gallon of fuel for your home or

car. This is another way to reduce our carbon footprint. You might not use markers but might know

of someone who does. Tell that person about the recycling program. I also collect used Brita water filters. Please simply bring them to church to give them to me. Another suggestion is to use cold water



in the rinse cycle of washing clothes.

our upcoming summer Mission Trip week. We will mainly be serving in the community of Lynn, which lies a few minutes outside the city of Boston. Our group will partner with local ministries to assist with providing programming for children,

We then took the train from North Penn to Suburban Station in Philly.



Upon arriving at Suburban Station, before we made it above-ground, we were almost immediately bombarded by people who were looking for something to keep them warm and something to snack on. Many of the people who initially approached us quickly told others what we were doing, which brought an even larger crowd. The individuals we were able to "Share the Warmth" with told us how thankful they were for our jackets, scarves, gloves and socks, as well as the food we provided. Their appreciation was quite apparent as many of them had little to no winter clothing, and nothing to eat.

Once we were finished giving clothes out to everyone below-ground, we made our way above-ground.

People who encountered us and saw what we were doing often told us "what a great thing we were doing". One little girl, who was walking with her mother, saw our bags of clothes and what we were



doing, and put a spare mitten she had in one of our bags. It was amazing to see how our outreach project could impact a little girl we did not know and prompt her to try and help others as well.

We then proceeded to walk the streets of Philadelphia handing out clothes and food to those who needed them. Everyone we helped was grateful for our kindness. Finally, we took what few items remained, and tied them around some tries in a park so that anyone who needed something could come and simply take something. Overall, the day was a huge success as we passed out all of our food and left the city with no spare clothes.


