# TASTE AND SEE

Taste and see that the LORD is good; blessed is the one who takes refuge in him. - *Psalm 34:8* 

What are your plans for Thanksgiving? If the dinner is to be held at your house, you may already be planning the menu and making shopping lists. Or if you will be celebrating the holiday at someone else's table, you may have been asked to contribute a dish to add to the meal. And if you are lucky enough to not be tasked with cooking or baking but merely enjoying, you may just be anticipating sitting down to a bountiful meal of traditional favorites. Whatever the case, you are probably preparing your taste buds for a treat!

I remember when our children were small, encouraging them to at least taste everything on their plates with the promise: "Try it; you'll like it!" (As long as it wasn't brussels sprouts we were talking about! I just couldn't lie!)

"Try it; you'll like it!" That's what the psalmist is urging us to do. He is inviting us to experience what he has discovered: the bountiful goodness of God's salvation. He is celebrating the fact that God has rescued him from his fears and troubles.

Psalm 34 is a song of gratitude we can all sing when God brings us out of a "close call" situation. But this exuberance and joy is only a foretaste of the future redemption God will bring to all who trust in him, to all whom God will redeem through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

God promises great blessings to his people. God will deliver, guard, supply, listen, and redeem all who trust in his power to save. God also gives us the ability to believe and trust in him. And in response we should seek to honor him in all things, speak truthfully, seek peace and justice, respect the dignity of all God's children, and humbly serve our God.

"Taste and see that the Lord is good." This psalm is an invitation to take God at his word, to trust in the Lord and experience his goodness firsthand, to know God personally, realizing that he loves us more than we can imagine.

The invitation is ours to receive, but it is also ours to extend. What opportunities has God given us to share his invitation with others? Who would God ask us to include in his rescue and deliverance? Who would God ask us to invite to his holy banquet?

Jesus, bread of life, living water, thank you for the hearty taste of salvation and new life; in your blessed name we offer our prayers of thanksgiving and praise. Amen.

Many thanks to everyone who contributed to the Rector's appeal for donations to buy canned goods and other non-perishable foods for **Thanksgiving Meal Bags** to be distributed to those in our community who are in need. Through your generosity, we were able to pack 30 bags! So, 30 households will now have a festive holiday meal! Each bag contains the makings for traditional favorites, including

stuffing, mashed potatoes, vegetables and fruit, brownie and biscuit mixes, coffee and drink mix, as well as a \$25.00 gift card to purchase a turkey or ham. And thank you to everyone who packed the bags at the Fall Fest.

The bags will be delivered to Keystone Opportunity Center in Souderton who will distribute the groceries to families in need throughout our local community.

And the response to the appeal for funds to provide the **materials for the Guatemala Mission Trip** has been tremendous! As of this date, we have collected over \$5,400.00, enough funding to build stoves and install water filtration systems in 27 homes that lack these basic needs. Rather than cook over open flames, indoor stoves will allow families to cook their meals in safer conditions and without the inhalation of the smoke that leads to chronic lung ailments. In addition, the environment is saved since the more efficient indoor stove only uses 10% of the wood needed to keep an open fire burning. And the gift of clean water for drinking, cooking, and bathing will reduce the exposure to debilitating and dangerous water-borne diseases. How many lives will be impacted and improved through your generous gifts! The eighteen Messiah missioners who will travel to Guatemala in January to accomplish this work will certainly be kept busy!





Our Youth are collecting new and gently-used winter apparel (coats, hats, scarves, gloves) for the homeless and needy. Your donations can be placed in the Narthex. Look for our poster and donation bin. Our children and youth will be putting the donations into care packages, which will then be distributed by the YOMs in Philadelphia. # Cordus Mundi Travels the World & Premieres a New CD



Bucks County-based male a cappella group Cordus Mundi begins the 2019-2020 concert season on November 23 & 24 with a program entitled "Music of the World". Concerts will take place on November 23 @ 7:30 p.m. at Church of the Messiah in Lower Gwynedd, and on November 24 @ 4:00 p.m. at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Doylestown.

As one might expect, Cordus' "Music of the World" program is a quick trip around the world of music, and includes songs and compositions from Scandinavia, Europe, the Americas, Asia, and more. Music comes from a typically wide range of composers, eras, and styles, including works from Greig, Lauridsen, Casals, Puccini, Alfven, Naverud, Arnesen, Betinis, Quartel, and Clarke, as well as traditional songs from several cultures.

The November concerts mark the formal re-

lease of Cordus Mundi's second CD, "Unforgettable", containing some of the best music made during the 2018-2019 Cordus concert season. CDs will be available for sale at the concerts for \$15.



On December 7, we will be heading to Normandy Farms for a chance to make a Christmas craft with the residents of the assisted living facility. Children and parents are invited to meet at Normandy Farms at 2:00. We will be sitting with a group of residents and helping them to

make their crafts while talking and getting to know them. We took this same trip last year and the residents really loved it and couldn't stop talking about it after we left! It's a great way to start the Christmas season!

We also ask that you save the date on Sunday, December 22 for our annual Christmas pageant following the 9:30 service! We will be preparing during the month of December, and then we get to celebrate the birth of Jesus together with the Parish and all the children!

Here's something fun you can try on home! In church school we made a prayer hand that helps us remember how to pray if we need a little help. You can use the one your child made in church school or make one of your own. Once children remember what each finger stands for, they will be able to use their own hand each day to remember their prayers!



If you have the opportunity to receive these or other meal items that you will not be using, please remember our local food cupboards and homeless shelters. Just leave them in the church freezer and let us know.



# INTERNATIONAL: STOVES & WATER FILTRATION SYSTEMS

In January, a mission team from Messiah will travel to Guatemala to build cooking stoves and install water filtration systems in poor homes without these necessities. A



generous member of the congregation, who asks to remain anonymous, has pledged to match the funds raised for purchasing materials, up to \$1600! This means that we have the potential to raise \$3200! Costing \$155 for a stove, and \$45 for a water system, this means that we may be able to supply 16 Guatemalan homes with these basic needs. 
